



Fieldwork Supervisor

This role is suited to an applicant with a minimum of 2 years' experience in commercial archaeology, who has carried out excavation, survey and site recording under the *Aboriginal Heritage Act 2006* and the *Heritage Act 2017*. Preference will be given to applicants who can demonstrate a working knowledge of these Acts, however demonstrated ability under interstate Acts will also be regarded highly.

You will be working within a collaborative team environment and will be expected to undertake and supervise field survey and archaeological excavations. On occasion, rural or interstate projects may require periods away from home.

The applicant will be required to complete projects within time and budget constraints, and must be committed to maintaining high levels of communication with stakeholders.

The successful applicants will be responsible for supervising archaeological complex and salvage excavations predominantly within Victoria. Applicants will be responsible for the supervision of a field team, and in maintaining high levels of communication with Tardis Archaeology management.

Applicants must have qualifications necessary to Supervise Complex Assessments and Salvage excavations under Regulation 65 (3) of the *Aboriginal Heritage Regulations 2018*.

As per the Minister's Guidelines, to be 'appropriately qualified in archaeology' to supervise an excavation, a person must have a degree in archaeology involving studies in Australian archaeology, to at least an honours level (or equivalent) or full membership of the Australian Association of Consulting Archaeologists Incorporated.

Qualifications & Experience:

- Minimum B.A. Hons in Archaeology or equivalent. Must include Australian indigenous archaeology;
- Construction Industry White Card;
- Additional Qualifications in historic archaeology, GIS/mapping or other specialist skill will be an advantage;
- Manual Driver's License; and
- Ideally candidates will also have current First Aid & CPR.
